NEW YORK – The Smile Face Museum will be open to the public this spring for the first time in over 20 years. Its extensive collection of more than 1000 objects will be on display **March 30 - April 27** at **228** ½ in Bushwick, Brooklyn.

Curator **Mark Sachs** founded The Smile Face Museum in 1992 in his Silver Spring, Maryland basement, and artist **Adrienne Garbini** is organizing this installation of The Museum. The Smile Face Museum showcases objects with smile faces from around the world produced with a multiplicity of materials by diverse means, organized with a vision for both ubiquity and precision. This unique collection contains artifacts from more than five decades of smile face cultural production, and offers a rare opportunity to experience a concrete accounting of a seemingly infinite presence. Sachs' curatorial directive for The Museum is that it encompass the sacred to the profane, the commonplace to the bizarre.

In addition to the original collection, the 2014 Smile Face Museum will feature the collections of Sarah Jacobson, Rita Mageary, Emily Stebbins, and The Busy Beaver Button Museum. The Museum will also present exhibitions of contemporary art, including the work of Daniel Albrigo, Leigh Aschoff, Ken Brown, E. Conner, E.D. The host for The Smile Face Museum, 228 ½, is an artist-run space in the basement of a private garden apartment. Please note our limited hours. The Museum will be open March 30, April 6, April 13, and April 27, and by appointment. Its exhibitions will rotate weekly. Event programming includes a private tour, a panel discussion organized by Lauren van Haaften-Schick with Devin Kenny and others, and film screening of Sarah Jacobson's Mary Jane's Not a Virgin Anymore (1998). The Museum will be closed for a tattoo special event April 20 at Black Square Tattoo in Brooklyn, organized by Gaby Wolodarski. There will be a Swap Meet managed by Carmelle Safdie's Choices on April 27. Please see the website for schedule and details.

During the run of the Smile Face Museum, the artist-run space **Sediment** in Richmond, Virginia will mount a satellite show with duplicate items from the Museum collection and special souvenir editions from the Museum shop.
